This most famous and most important Civil War Battle occurred over three hot summer days, July 1 to July 3, 1863, around the small market town of Gettysburg, Pennsylvania.

Gettysburg: Special Lecture and Tour

At the opening of the Civil War, Gettysburg was a typical northern community, but in July 1863, Gettysburg found itself at the center of a great American Civil War battle. In the aftermath of battle, townspeople provided medical assistance, buried the dead, and began preserving the battleground.

Attendees will have dessert at **The Gettysburg Civil War Museum & Visitors Center**. During dessert, Dr. Joseph Lex will give a presentation on the assassination of President Abraham Lincoln.

Following dessert and Dr. Lex's presentation, attendees will have the opportunity to tour the **Civil War Museum** privately, view a short movie and the Cyclorama, which puts the viewer in the heart of the ill-fated Pickett's Charge.
